# Who we are

Initially established in 2005 by the Ministry of Education to support the action areas in the 2004 Interim Tertiary e-Learning Framework, the Tertiary e-Learning Reference Group (TeLRG) moved from being a representative group to an expert group in 2010. Co-hosted by the Ministry of Education and Ako Aotearoa – The National Centre for Tertiary Teaching Excellence, the TeLRG's main purpose is to provide advice to its co-hosts on issues relating to tertiary e-learning. This includes work relating to the following objectives:

- 1. Assess the current state of tertiary e-learning.
- 2. Assist with the development of New Zealand's future tertiary e-learning priorities.
- 3. Provide advice for central agencies/organisations and the sector on relevant work programmes/initiatives.
- 4. Provide advice on current and potential funding streams to support e-learning.
- Assist agencies and the sector to take a coordinated approach to priority projects and where appropriate, co-develop these with the relevant parties.

### **TeLRG** members

The TeLRG is first and foremost an expert advisory group; consisting of people nominated by e-learning or other appropriate professional associations and peak bodies, with involvement from experts outside these associations to ensure appropriate perspective across the breadth of the tertiary sector. # **TeLRG** activities and projects

The group has made important contributions to a number of key e-learning projects in New Zealand, examples include:

**2016 Scenarios** - a collaboration project through DEANZ is an online, interactive resource for organisational and programme future planning. Funded by Ako Aotearoa via its National Project Fund.

Annotated bibliographies on aspects of tertiary e-learning - the planned series of Ministry of Education annotated bibliographies has so far produced two reports on learner participation, retention and success, and, organisational approaches to e-learning. Two further bibliographies are in development: Government and sector-level tertiary e-learning initiatives, and, e-learning in the workplace.
